THEOLOGICAL LESSONS PREPARATION FOR TEACHING STORIES

Remember:

- Follow the timeline in teaching stories, always considering students' questions even if they precede the lesson.
- Always keep in mind that the purpose of stories is also evangelization.
- An essential contribution of history teaching is also theology. In the field of theological teaching, the method to be used must be participatory. Each theological lesson learned must be applied both at the student level and at the church level. In short, get the student to identify the theological lesson and support it by justifying it.

Here are some questions you can ask to lead the lesson. These questions are relative historically. They can approach God (his person, his will, his work, his relationship with man, ...), man (his nature, his relationship with God, his final destiny, ...), Satan (his person, his nature, his works, his relationship with God and with man).

- 1. What does this story teach us about God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, Satan, the devil, man and his final destiny...?
- 2. How? (What makes you tell this truth of this story)
- 3. Knowing this truth, what should we do now? How should we live our faith?
- 4. How can we apply this truth to our life?
- 5. How can others perceive the application of this truth in our life?
- 6. How do we lead the people in our congregation to live this truth?
- 7. Are there any references to a people of God?
- 8. What must be done to be chosen by God (example of Abraham) according to this story?
- 9. What are the conditions today to be chosen by God?
- 10. In this story, are there any examples to follow or not to follow?
